1.FORMULATING LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Well defined learning objectives are required for best teaching and learning processes. Learning objectives helps the teachers to identify students' achievement in learning. They are assessment tools. Science teachers give emphasis to framing learning objectives according to McCormack and Yager Taxonomy Teaching sessions are organized by optional teachers to describe learning objectives in their respective classes. Learning objectives are explained on the basis of the revised bloom's taxonomy (RBT). Followed by discussion sessions are conducted in the classroom. Teachers explained the practical side also. During Discussion students are asked to frame learning objectives according to their school topics. This session helped the students to write learning objectives in lesson plans in the time of Internship



2.CONTENT MAPPING

Content mapping was the process of organizing content based on needs of different stages or goals. Based on the syllabus, the optional teacher taught the structure of content mapping. She explained how to create content maps and asked students to construct content maps. Students create mind maps as part of their optional task and upload them in the google classroom This session improved students' skill in learning and to create content maps.

3. Lesson planning/ Individualized Education plans (IEP)

The curriculum B. Ed program ensures sufficient training in instructional design and lesson planning. First sem and Second sem activities are totally devoted to this purpose. Majority of teaching training sessions are carried out by Optional teachers. 
9. ICT based learning


11. Mobilizing relevant and varied resources
